Dear Captain Wiemers,

My name is Evelyn Edson and my husband, Paul, was a career Coast Guardsman. One of his postings was at USCG Ponce Inlet. Unfortunately, Paul died in 2008, and I am forever indebted to the crew at Station Ponce for providing Paul's burial at sea.

This past August, a friend of mine contacted Senior Chief Jeff Graham and asked if I could visit the station where Paul served. The Senior Chief graciously agreed and he and the Executive Office, BM1 Jennifer Waldo met me, and my son Larry at the operations building and escorted us to the galley where we all had lunch. After lunch, Senior Chief Graham and BM1 Waldo took us on a tour of the station and the boats. I so much enjoyed being back on the station with some of the wonderful Coast Guard family that I enjoyed for many years with Paul. In photo 1, left to right is Senior Chief Graham, BM1 Waldo, me, my friend Earl Tingle, and my son, Larry.

More recently, we had a terrible hurricane (Irma) pass close to us, and my son and I had to evacuate to my daughter's house. Upon returning to my home which is about two blocks from the ocean, I found a lot of trash and debris from the trees and shrubs of my house and my neighbors' houses. Senior Chief called to ask if I had survived the storm, and I told him about the damage I had from Hurricane Irma. Within about an hour, Senior Chief Graham arrived at my house with four of his crew and they cleaned every piece of debris from my yard and two young men even repaired the screen door on my patio. I didn't ask for this help; the Senior Chief did this out of care and concern for a member of the Coast Guard family. The Coast Guard does more than risk their lives to save others; they never forget those who have served before them. In photo 2, Seaman Cory Walsh and Damage Controlman Ryan Hamm are repairing my screen door.

Please pass on my thanks to Senior Chief Graham and his crew for their dedication and commitment to the citizens of New Smyrna Beach, and especially me.


